

My Library Card

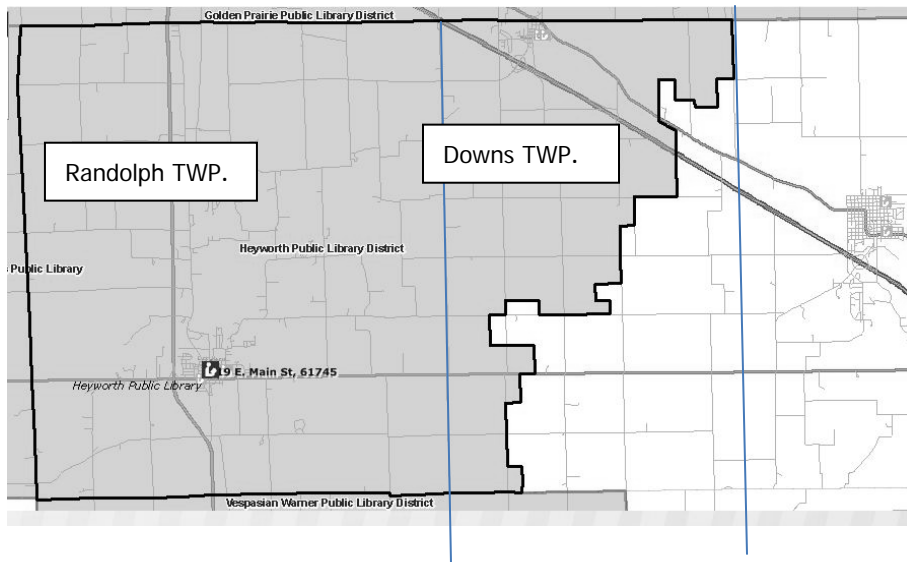
Your library card is your ticket to take items home. Even if you do not have a library card, you may use library books or magazines while you are at the library. In order to check out and take home books, magazines, CDs, DVDs, or audio books you must show your library card. The Heyworth Public Library honors library cards from all Alliance Member Libraries and Vespasian Warner Public Library District (Clinton, IL).

How to get a library card:

To apply for your library card, please provide a photo ID with a second proof of current Randolph Township or designated Downs Township residence and visit the library to fill out a brief application. Examples of acceptable identification are driver's license, voter registration card, checkbook, or utility bill. Children and teens (3-16) can receive a library card with a parent or legal guardian who also has a library card. Their parent or legal guardian must sign the children's application that they will be responsible for their children's library materials.

How much a library card costs:

Nothing! A Heyworth Public Library card is issued free of charge to anyone living within the city limits of Heyworth, Randolph Township or designated Downs Township residence. See the map below for the area of the Downs Township that is included in Heyworth Public Library District. When a person lives in an area of McLean County that does not have access to public library service, a library card from the Heyworth Public Library may be purchased for \$65 for one year.
